Rick St. Hilaire resides in Lebanon, NH and has been practicing law since 1993. He is a former prosecutor who served as Grafton County Attorney. Currently, he focuses much of his legal work as Senior Vice President and Deputy General Counsel at a global not-for-profit that is counted among the Fortune 1000 on the delivery of international humanitarian aid to those in need in Ukraine, the Middle East, and Africa.
